
# **Review of the Week**

In the final week before half term, children were taking part in phonics assessments to move into their new groups once they had learned all the sounds in their current group. We saw lots of children moving groups and some even moving up more than 2 groups! Well done!

Please make sure that your child is reading at least three times a week and practicing their phonics on the Seesaw videos weekly. These videos have been carefully selected for each class and year group. To help adults at home to practice these sounds further, teachers will be sticking the sounds that your child knows and needs to practice in their reading log. We know that getting reading right as early as possible, will give your child the best life opportunities as reading is the key to all learning.

As part of improving the teaching and learning at FHIS, teachers were working hard on Friday's teacher training day updating our whole school training on Kinetic Letters — our handwriting scheme of work. Kinetic Letters teaches children how to make their bodies stronger and the steps to take in developing

# **Attendance Matters**



# Did you know that if your child has 2 days off this term, they will be considered as persistently absent?

Persistently absent is where your child's attendance falls below 96%.

Attendance to school has a significant impact on your child's success in life. In many cases where attendance is lower, this can negatively impact a child both academically and socially and emotionally. By missing school, children can miss key learning and opportunities to socialise and build friendships with their peers.

As a school, we understand that at this time of year, there are many illnesses going around and appreciate that keeping children well and healthy during the winter months can be a challenge. However, as a school we have a duty of care to inform you of concerns regarding your child's attendance. New legislation in place for schools, means that we have a legal obligation to report cases of persistent absence from school to the local authority, which may result in a fine or meetings with the local authority attendance officer.

We guide you to refer to the NHS illness information if you are unsure as to whether you should send your child into school or speak to a member of the attendance team, who will be more than happy to work with you to ensure your child is best supported and happily attending school.




