Kusama uses polka dots to create the illusion that the image is three-dimensional (having depth, width, and height)				
Mono Print			The monoprint is a form of printmaking where the image can only be made once, unlike most printmaking which allows for multiple originals.  The colour used to create monoprints is usually waterbased ink. A roller is used to apply the ink evenly over the a printing sheet. This is usually an acrylic sheet or other washable flat surfaces.
