Key Vocabulary	Important Facts	
Urban — the region surrounding a city which is developed with houses, shops, buildings, roads, railways and bridges. Rural — area that is sparsely populated with less than 10,000 people.	Maps present information about the world in a simple, visual way. Outside is the space external to an indoor area.	
Town — larger than a village and smaller than a city. City -large population, greater in size and density than a town. Hamlet — small human settlement, smaller than a village. Village — small human settlement usually in rural setting. Map — a representation of an area with symbols.	Inside is the space between walls or boundaries. Human features are characteristics of a place that were made by humans, for example shops and roads. Physical features are characteristics of a place that are naturally occurring. These include features of the land (hills, mountains), bodies	
Aerial photographs - are photographs taken from above.	of water (lakes, rivers) and vegetation (trees, plants).
