The Hebrew word <i>Torah</i> is traditionally translated as 'law', which in this context means teaching, instruction or guidance. The most well-known of these laws are the <i>Ten Commandments</i> , but the <i>Torah</i> contains a total of 613 commandments or <i>mitzvah</i> covering many aspects of daily life, including family, personal hygiene and diet. The <i>Ten Commandments</i> were recorded on two tablets of stone, and together they form the basis of God's <i>covenant</i> with Moses.
